
DEUTERONOMY 6 SHEMA, ISRAEL!



- Shema starts with Deut 6:4
- Mark 12:28 "....Jesus answered, 'the foremost is Hear O Israel! The Lord our God is one....you shall love the Lord with all your heart...."
- Deut 6:4 "Hear O Israel! The Lord is our God, the Lord is one...you shall love the Lord with all your heart...."
- > YESHUA WAS QUOTING THE SHEMA!!!

WHY THE MISQUOTE?


- Jesus BEGINS his statement with "Hear O Israel!"
- Why does the Church invariably drop that part?
- Do we *drop* the 10 Commandments and "love the Lord your God" because it was addressed directly to Israel? <u>NO!</u>
- There are NOT separate commands and gospels for the Church versus for Israel!



A RE-STATEMENT OF THE LAW



- The REASON for the restatement is that this is the NEW generation
- The OLD generation is dead, and they had NOT properly passed the Law along
- Moses affirms he will teach ONLY what the Lord has instructed
- Two thoughts:
- 1) Land flowing with milk and honey
- 2) This is a fulfillment of the Abrahamic Covenant from 600 years earlier
- BOTH covenants still valid!



MOSES' "SERMON ON THE MOUNT"

Similarities and parallels between Yeshua's and Moses' "sermon on the mount"

Moses interrupts the giving of the Law to interject the Shema

- Shema is the context for understanding and carrying out The Law
- The Law established the relationship between God and Israel


OBEDIENCE = LOVING THE LORD

- God says OBEDIENCE is the response of love that He seeks
- Obedience cannot be disconnected from loving God
- In Greco-Roman times love moved away from being an ACTION and became an EMOTION
- 9 definitions of "love" in Webster's ALL indicate it as primarily an emotion



MATTHEW 5: THE SERMON ON THE MOUNT

- This is core statement of the Christian faith
- "Blessed are".....the
 Beatitudes
- "You are the salt of the earth...."
- Suddenly Jesus stops and interjects a crucial comment in order to establish the CONTEXT
- Matt 5:17 "Do not think I came to abolish the Law...."





YESHUA'S WARNING NOT HEEDED

- Hebrew society forgot the "love YHWH" context and adopted new and mechanical rituals
- The CHURCH has forgotten the "love YHWH" context and adopted mechanical liturgies and spirit-less doctrines
- > OBEDIENCE IS THE EVIDENCE OF OUR LOVE OF GOD!



HEAR O ISRAEL!

- "HEAR O ISRAEL! THE LORD IS OUR GOD, THE LORD IS ONE."
- Hear = shema
- Shema does NOT mean passive listening
- Shema means to HEAR AND OBEY! ACTION!
- In Hebrew: "YHWH eloheinu, YHWH echad"
- This Means that God is:
- 1) The ONLY God that exists
- 2) The ONLY object of worship permitted
- 3) He is unified, not a collection of "pieces"
- 4) His name is YHWH
- 5) He directed this statement TO ISRAEL


"YOU SHALL LOVE YHWH YOUR ELOHIM..."

- Love as defined in the Bible is PRIMARILY AN ACTION
- Did the Lord command an EMOTION or did He command an ACTION?
- Conjuring up an emotion is very difficult for a human
- DOING a physical command is something man has the capacity to do, even in disagreement
- True love of God, however, involves MORE than only physical action
- > Love is also a state of mind and a state of our spirit
- Emotion IS a component of love, but it is NOT the chief one!

LOVE IS THE OPPOSITE OF HATE

- To HATE God is to REJECT God
- To HATE God is be UNFAITHFUL to God
- > To LOVE God is to accept Him
- The highest essence of accepting Him is submission
- > Submission IS obedience





"LOVE THE LORD WITH ALL YOUR HEART..."

- > Levav or Lev = heart
- Means the blood-pumping organ
- Hebrews did NOT think of the heart as the seat of emotions and morals as we do
- For Hebrews, the heart had the function of the "mind" or "brain"
- We should translate this phrase as: "Love the Lord will all of your MIND"



"with all our soul...."



- Soul = Nefesh
- Nefesh can mean Living Being, soul, essence, life, breath, the self
- "with all your might"
- Be-khol me-odekah
- Means to use exceedingly great effort and conscious thought
- Deuteronomy is the first book of Torah to speak of man loving God
- Deut 6:6 "and these words.....shall be on your HEART.."
- Note that this is NOT a NT event!
- But in both NT and OT to be "written on our hearts" means to be written on our MINDS!
